## Pratt Airman Among Heli' Crash Victims

WIESBADEN, West Germany (AP) — U.S. Air Force Headquarters in Burope released the names Saturday of the 16 erew and passengers aboard the American helicopter that crashed and burned Friday in a meadow near the north German towns of Paderborn and Guetersloh.
